This project aims to significantly improve the public infrastructure of the village to provide safe pedestrian access for all age groups, particularly vulnerable groups to include the young, old & people with limited mobility. An improved pedestrian network will encourage greater footfall & connectivity within the village, enhancing the social, economic & community development helping to create a sustainable, vibrant, safe & inviting village core.

The Public Realm Improvement Works proposed for Tarmonbarry Village will support the community who continually seek to promote their village as an attractive and safe place to visit & dwell. Structured improvements of the public infrastructure will make Tarmonbarry a better place to work and live. This project will see the provision of new paving, new pedestrian spaces, and an outdoor dining area. The proposed works will support the existing hospitality providers within Tarmonbarry to meet the challenges presented to their businesses as a result of the COVID 19 pandemic & in doing so help to ensure the village can maximize opportunities to develop & grow given its strategic location adjoining the River Shannon & the N5 National Primary Route.
