INTRODUCTION

Access to heritage sites was a major issue raised at public consultation meetings during the preparation of the County Roscommon Heritage Plan 2004-2008.

This leaflet highlights where public access is possible to heritage sites around the county.

Based on Action 2.2.1 of the County Roscommon Heritage Plan - 'Carry out an audit of heritage sites in the county, to identify those that have public access, including special needs access', this audit was carried out on behalf of Co. Roscommon Heritage Forum by DARE Ltd.

The 'A Heritage Access Audit of Co. Roscommon' survey report and database contain details of 82 heritage sites around Co. Roscommon. Each site is described under headings of grid reference, 'Discovery Series' map number, site description, access details, disabled access details, signage, onsite interpretation, parking & facilities present, and ownership.

Not all sites included in the audit have public access. Improvements could be made at some of the sites. Full details of 'A Heritage Access Audit of County Roscommon' are available on the Heritage Office section of www.roscommoncoco.ie

NATURAL HERITAGE SITES

Co. Roscommon is dominated by wetland habitats. The county is bordered to the west by the River Suck and to the east by the River Shannon, which regularly spread out over the adjacent callows during the winter months. Lakes are abundant especially in the northern half of the county. Seasonal lakes or Turloughs are regular features of the landscape. Lakeshore and riverside amenity areas provide public access to watercourses.

Bogs

Public access to bogs is not recommended.
However the 'Suck Valley Way' provides access for walkers across the raised bog of
Cooliskea/Trien/Cloonfelliv, while the 'Miners
Way' provide access for walkers across the blanket bog of Kilronan & Corrie Mountains.

CULTURAL HERITAGE SITES

Cultural Heritage can be defined as human interaction with the natural world. People have been influencing the natural landscape of County Roscommon for over 6,000 years and the results of this interaction is a diverse collection of burial tombs, settlement sites, artefacts, buildings, industries, art, music, folklore and traditions.

A representative sample of cultural heritage sites from different periods of human history in Roscommon, were surveyed as part of the Audit and have been grouped under diverse headings.
