#### County Surveyor's Report

to the County Council upon proposed  
renewal of Direct Labour Scheme for main-  
tenance of public roads and works.

Gentlemen

As the three years term of the  
existing Direct Labour Scheme will expire  
on the 31<sup>st</sup> March next, and the mode of  
procedure for renewal as prescribed by the  
Local Government Order occupies some  
months to carry out, I have to submit for  
your consideration the accompanying Direct  
Labour Renewal Scheme.

Before preparing it I obtained from  
every District Council, at the Quarterly  
Meetings lately held, an expression of their  
views in regard to the Direct Labour Work  
in

in order that I might embody them as far as possible in making out Renewal Scheme.

The three District Councils which have had their whole Districts worked by Direct Labour under the existing Scheme, viz :— Castlerea, Roscommon and Brokestown are unanimous in approval of the work and agree to renewal at estimate cost not to exceed the amounts allowed for the three year's term now almost expired, and with any adjustment of its distribution among the sections, which experience of the work enables me to recommend.

In Boyle District, where only certain selected roads have been maintained by Direct Labour, the Council also expressed their approval of the work and desire that the Direct Labour Work should be continued on those groups of roads, and at the same time authorised me to make any small additions or modifications which experience of the work might enable me to recommend in preparing the Renewal Scheme.

Existing contracts in Athlone and Ballinasloe Districts necessitate a postponement of Direct Labour Work pending the expiration of the contract period, and these two Councils prefer to postpone the introduction of Direct Labour for the present.

Ballycotton-on-Shannon District Council have not yet tried Direct Labour, and prefer to postpone its consideration for the present.

Therefore I have omitted the Districts of Athlone, Ballinasloe and Ballycotton-on-Shannon altogether.

That is the total expenditure proposed in each District is not greater than that allowed under the present scheme, but the distribution of the expenditure in each District among the Sections is slightly re-arranged

arranged where experience of the work enables me to know that such adjustment is advisable.

If you approve of the Scheme as recommended by me, your approval is only provisional. The Scheme must be then sent to each District Council concerned for consideration and suggested modification after which it must again come before you in order you may consider the recommendations of the District Councils, and after modifying the Scheme as far as you consider advisable you then issue the Scheme as finally adopted, and with the approval of the Local Government Board, the Scheme, at the appointed time comes into force.

I beg to make an application that owing to my length of service in your employment, the manner in which the duties of my Office have been discharged, and the very heavy extra duties placed upon me by Acts of Parliament since I became Secretary and the extra work and responsibility imposed on me by the Direct Labour System that you take into consideration the question of fixing my salary as Secretary at £370. The Committee, whose report will be before you have recommended strongly that I should get a liberal increase, on account of the facts mentioned before.

The following report of the General Management Committee adjourned from the Meeting held on the 14<sup>th</sup> November, 1911, to which Committee the Local Government Board's letter dated the 29<sup>th</sup> August, 1911, relative to increased duties in the Secretary's Office was referred, was submitted and marked "Read".

A letter from the Local Government Board dated the 29<sup>th</sup> August having reference to the work done in the Secretary's Office and which was laid before the County Council at their Meeting on the 1<sup>st</sup> September last, having been referred to our Committee, the under-signed members met on the 6<sup>th</sup> November 1911, and have agreed to the following report:-

Mr. Heverin having made a statement to us regarding the greatly increased duties of his Office, chiefly through the establishment of the Direct Labour System, (which has necessitated the engagement by Mr. Heverin, of one additional clerk permanently, and of others according as occasion requires) but also through the Act of Parliament dealing with Motor Buses and the duties paid under that Act, and from other causes, and having shown to us that the salary attached to his Office was almost, if not quite the lowest paid in Ireland for similar services, we strongly recommend to the County Council

that Mr. Hevesin be granted liberal increase to his salary, on account of the increased duties referred to, and also having regard to his length of service, and the very efficient manner in which the work of his Office has been done during the period of his appointment. Being asked to name a figure to which he would expect his salary to be raised, he mentioned £ 370 per annum, but while we are of opinion that his views should receive every consideration, we do not think it well to recommend the exact amount to which we believe Mr. Hevesin's salary should be raised but content ourselves with expressing our opinion that justice and fair play require that the increase should not be of a niggardly character. Regarding the suggestion contained in the letter of the Local Government Board that there should be one or more assistants in the Secretary's Office directly responsible to the Council, we think such suggestion well worthy of consideration, and we desire to add that ~~we desire to add~~ that we believe that the remuneration at present allowed to Mr. Hevesin's very able and obliging assistants is entirely inadequate having regard to the nature of their duties and the manner in which they discharge them.
