The Secretary read the following letter from Mr. O'Malley, late Collector of Poor Date:-

Rathconor House,

Doscommon,

14th June, 1913.

Sir /

I would feel obliged if you bring this letter before the County Council at their Annual Meeting to be held to-morrow

to-morrow.

The County Council at their last meeting very kindly passed a resolution asking the Local Government Board to sanction payment of all poundage fees due to me. The Board partially complied with the terms of the resolution, but still there is a sum of about £25 due to me for the collection ended 30th September, 1911. I would ask the Council to pass a resolution asking the Local Government Board to reconsider their decision re this sum as they granted a similar concession to Ex-Collector Timilty whose poundage fees extended back for a period of six years. As the Council have suffered no loss by my resignation I trust they will see their way to comply with my request.

'That we again ask the Local Government Board to allow us to pay poundage fees to Ex-Collector O'Malley on amounts lodged after the close of the half-year ended 30th September, 1911. The amount of poundage due is £25-2-6 and we consider it a great hardship on the Collector to keep him out of this amount, as owing to a severe

severe accident he was compelled to resign his position as Collector after closing his collection, and as the Council have suffered no loss we hope the Board will comply with our request. We may also remind the Board that they granted a similar concession to us in the case of Ex-Collector Timilty whose poundage fees were due for six years."

The Secretary submitted letters from the Secretary, National Health Insurance Commission, and from the Inland Revenue Office, Dublin, relative to Bond required to be given by the County Council to the commission, and Bond from the Secretary, County Roscommon Insurance Society to the County Council. The commission stated in their letter that the only Bond required is to be given by the County Council to the commission incurs no expense and that the Secretary of the Roscommon County Insurance Society must provide the Bond to be given by him at his own expense. The Secretary stated that according

according to the letter from the Inland Revenue the Bond - which the Commission stated incurred no expense - was liable to Stamp Duty of 10/-.

The Secretary submitted letters from one of the National Health Insurance Inspectors enclosing Forms to be filled up in connection with men employed under the Direct Labour Scheme. The following order was made thereon:-

The Secretary submitted letter from Mr. Joseph Boen, Knockglass, Ballinameen, Boyle, enclosing receipt for money paid for Dipping Stations for 1910 & 1911. The following order was made on letter:- "Certificate of Veterinary Surgeon required. Application for payment should be sent in at close of Dipping period."

The Secretary submitted letter from Mr. Malachy Mr. Governor of Willsgrove, Ballintubber, caretaker of Swin Bach applying

applying for the sum of £1-5-0 for paint and painting Swin Bach. The following order was made on letter:- "Mr. McGovern to obtain certificate from Mr. Moran U.S. that the Swin Bach was properly painted and that the sum claimed is reasonable".

The Secretary read letter from Mr. Finneran Ballinagare, Baslesea, claiming the sum of £1 for repairs to Swin Bach and for hire of horse to convey Swin Bach to Baslesea Show Yard. Order made thereon:- "Refused".

The Secretary read letter from Mr. Finneran tendering his resignation as baselake of Swin Bach. The following order was made thereon:- "Accepted".

An application was read from Mr. Thomas Collins, Ballinagare, Baslesea, stating he was willing to take charge of the Swin Bach which Mr. Michael Finneran of Ballinagare was giving up. The following order was made thereon:- "Mr. Collins to get the Dip Yub on the usual conditions".

The Secretary read letter from Mr. Flannery, Ogulla, Tylsk, baselake of Swin Bach, requesting that the notices of intention to dip sheep should be forwarded by the police to the baselakers of Dipping Tyls.

Tubs and asking for permission that the extracts of the Sheep Dipping Order might be published by him. The following order was made on letter : - "That the Notices mentioned in letter be forwarded to Inspectors. Council have no objection to extracts from Sheep Dipping Order being posted up."

An Application from Mr. Loney, const- keeper, Rosecommon, for increased remuneration for extra work imposed upon him was read and the following order was made thereon : - "The consideration of this application was adjourned to next Quarterly meeting in consequence of the small number present at this meeting. Those present expressing the opinion that his application was entitled to consideration, his duties having been considerably increased since the Local Government Act came into operation and especially of late years in connection with other Acts of Parliament."
