case is decided. If Collector
Geogly succeeds in proving his
innocence said Collectors will
only too gladly hand over their
respective appointments to him.

I wish to bring under
 your notice the proposals for
 New and Special Works which
 I have received to date and the
 amount of which I must say
 has reached an alarmingly
 high figure. I have calculated
 them all showing the number
 and amount of proposals made
 by each burgess and the
 amount for each electoral area

You will see from the
 Table that the amounts from
 Basildon and Elstree electoral
 areas

Areas are exceptionally high and of course when all this is now a County-at-Large charge it virtually concerns every bannillo. The total for the whole County to date is £11,316-10-0 which represents 10d in the pound, and one bannillo has applications in to the value of over £1200 and several are bordering on the thousand mark.

The Roads Meeting will be held on February 1st at which Meeting all these Proposals will be finally considered and my Roads Scheme must be lodged with the Secretary of the County Council before January 16th. The last date by law for receiving these Proposals is January 1st. Therefore I would suggest that all these proposals be referred back to committees of the different areas to be gone into by them and reduced to a reasonable figure having due regard to the necessity at the present time for economy. In order to do this it will be necessary to hold Committee Meetings between January 1st and 16th 1926 in the different areas and I would suggest the following dates

dates if they would meet with
your approval:-

Boyle	2 nd Jan. 1926	(Saturday)	1 o'clock
Banskeragh	5 th	(Tuesday)	do
Goscommon	13 th	(Wednesday)	do
Grosstewton	9 th	(Saturday)	do.

I would also like to take
this opportunity of pointing
out to the Council that under
the new Local Government Act
a lot of extra work in connection
with roads is thrown on to
the County Surveyor's Department.
We have now to keep separate
Machinery Accounts which
entail a lot of work and the
amount of work done by
machinery nowadays is practically
equal to that by Direct Labour.
and then Forms 20 and 22 which
used to be formerly prepared by
the Rural District Clerks have
now to be prepared by me.

Then in future separate Accounts
must be kept for each road
in the County when formerly
several roads in a Section were
bunched together and one account
kept for all.

Considering all this
and the still extra amount of
work

entailed by the preparation of Estimates and consideration of Special Works Proposals from now till the end of March it is absolutely impossible to carry on unless I get the temporary assistance of a qualified Clerk for three months and I respectfully ask you, Gentlemen, to allow me this.

1. A Sub-committee to be set up in each electoral area consisting of the elected members of the County Council in the Area See 58 (5) L. G. Act 1925.
2. The titles of the Sub-committee to be as follows:- Boyle Sub-committee, Ballyea Sub-committee, Kilphin Sub-committee and Roscommon Sub-committee and the places of meeting shall be respectively Boyle Townhouse, Ballyea Townhouse, Kilphin (Strohstown ex-Union Buildings) and Roscommon Townhouse.
3. (a) The Sub-committee shall meet in the month of January in each year and any other dates as required to consider applications for New Works and repairs to by-roads and shall submit their findings to the County Council for the Roads Meeting. Proposals to be forwarded to the Secretary of the County Council and to the County Surveyor before the 1st day of November in each year.
(a) The Sub-committee shall at its

its first Meeting appoint one of its members as Chairman who will hold office until the first Meeting after the election of Chairman of the County Council in each year.

4. For the purpose of co-ordinating the works previously performed by the District Council, and to give adequate representation to the people concerned, we request the Board of Health under Section 13 L. G. Act 1925 to appoint the same Sub-committee as mentioned in Clause 4 of this Scheme, and when matters relating to Labourers and Sanitary Acts and any other matters hitherto discharged by District Councils come before the Board of Health for consideration, the Members of the Sub-committee be entitled to sit, act and vote with the Board of Health on matters appertaining to their respective areas, or, (as an alternative), the Members of the Sub-committee be entitled to discuss and offer their views but not to vote on matters appertaining to their areas)

areas).

That one District Council Clerk with the addition of a Typist go to the Board of Health offices one Clerk to be engaged as Checker of all Rate Collectors and Rent Collectors in the County and one Clerk go to the County Council office.

Gentlemen

I was to have Tenders today at your Meeting for the repairs of Ballaghaderreen and Frenchpark bonhousues but was not able to have them finished. I have measured up and made a drawing for Ballaghaderreen bonhouse and have gone into the matter of housing the Guards in it, with the Chief Superintendent. To do this a great deal of extra construction is necessary and it cannot possibly

possibly be done for the amount of money allowed for compensation. The amount allowed is £900 and to put it in proper condition for the Guards to live in will take £1600. Therefore you will have to decide if you will put up the extra money and charge a suitable rent to recover it, or whether you will only utilise the money you were allowed which will only put it back into the same condition that it was in.

It will be necessary for you to decide this to-day in order to give me a chance to complete the plans as of course it is no use advertising for work if there is not sufficient money to meet it. It can then be advertised and Tenders accepted at your next meeting and both the bondhouses would be ready for occupation by May the 1st.

The latter's District includes the town of Boyle where there is a very large amount of refuse. In order to show how the Council appreciate collectors who do their work efficiently we trust the Ministry will forward sanction so that payment can be made before Christmas."

behalf of Town Dwellers and we welcome the report that there is to be introduced in the Dail in the near future a Bill which comprises:- (1) Fixity of Tenure, (2) Fair Rent bounds, (3) Provision for doing repairs for which the landlord is liable, (4) the right of a tenant to receive notice from the owner when the owner intends to sell his property so as to give the tenant the first chance to purchase and thus put an end to the scandal of people purchasing houses over the heads of occupying tenants. That the Government be asked to give facilities for the passing of a Bill embracing the clauses mentioned above and that our local representatives be requested to accord the Bill their whole-hearted support.
