Dear Cathaoirleach and Members,

Tidy Towns and Amenity Grants

- Projects progressing include WHO affiliation and official launch of Boyle as Age Friendly Town.

Social Inclusion

Town Teams Community

- Tender request for Monksland Community Centre feasibility study consultancy works advertised via e-tenders
- Community Sports day held in August in Monksland
- Roscommon Town Team Wellness weekend event scheduled for September.

Roscommon Arts Centre

- During renovations at the arts centre, the visual art programme is being presented offsite through exhibitions, residencies and publications. Fiona McDonald completed her work in the county in August and the work produced was launched in our offsite exhibition in King House.
- 18 applications for the Historic Commission/Margaret Cousins were received in August. These were recently reviewed by an independent assessor and the artist Eimear Walsh was selected.
- Writer in residence Sue Rainsford has produced 2 newly commissioned publications in response to Fiona McDonald's exhibition in King House & RVAF award winner Siobhan O'Connor in Oonagh Young Gallery, Dublin.
- Outside of the visual art programme, no other events took place during the month of August as building works have commenced and this period was left dark to accommodate works on the foyer space. The schedule of works has now however changed and the majority of the work on this space has now been pushed back until the end of November.
- The box office has re-located to Aras an Chontae for the duration of the renovations and both the Arts Centre Director and Marketing Officer are now also located here.
- The Arts Centre Director has taken on the role of Acting Arts Office and the Marketing
 Development Officer has been providing administrative support to the Department also in the
 absence of the Arts Officer. The Technical Manager has been assisting in the library during this
 period.

Planning Section Management Report - August 2018

Forward Planning

Vacant Site Levy work arising from the Urban Regeneration and Housing Act 2015

The Valuer appointed to undertake valuations on all sites entered on the Vacant Site Register concluded his work, and the Planning Authority subsequently issued formal notification of the valuations to all owners. In accordance with the provisions of the Act, owners now have the opportunity to appeal the valuations to the Valuation Tribunal.

Development Management (including enforcement activity)

The table below summarises Development Management activity in the Planning Section in August. A total of 42 valid applications were received, which represented a reduction from the July figure (54). 52 decisions were issued on planning applications in August, of which only 1 was a refusal. The summary table below reflects the recent changes in the Development Management structure, with a change from development management areas based on the 3 Municipal Districts to two areas – 'Roscommon South' and 'Roscommon North.'

Unfinished Housing Developments

Similar to the situation in July, due to the summer holiday period, development activity on site in Unfinished Housing Developments was not as prevalent as in earlier periods this year. Developers continued to undertake agreed site resolution works in 3 developments (two in Ballaghadereen and one in Rooskey). Direct labour workers engaged by Roscommon County Council also continued with their programme of work in developments in Ballinagare and Frenchpark.

Two developments (in Ballaghadereen and Strokestown) have also been deemed to be of a satisfactory standard to enable the taking in charge process to be progressed, and as part of this, Schedules have been sent to Irish Water in respect of the developments.

Two contracts were also rewarded in August for site resolution works at developments in Boyle and Tarmonbarry.

- 1. Demonstrate the importance of mainstreaming entrepreneurship education within VET for the benefit of individual students and wider regional development.

- 9 applications for Town and Village funding 2018 sent to Department, confirmation of approvals expected in August.

Publicity & Media:

Publicity Material/Website: Advertisement development for Go Lakelands and Roscommon people Summer magazine.

Signage: 2 further signs for Casey's Roscommon being developed for King House and Arigna Mining Experience.

Social Media: Information from attractions and communities being updated on daily bases. Enterprise Department has agreed to coordinate Council Social Media usage for Arts, Heritage, Economic Development, Social Inclusion and Community Section. 3 adverts posted on Facebook with – 6,556 people reached. 6 adverts posted on Twitter.

Events Calendar: Enterprise Department approving events and promoting through numerous channels and contacts. GIS Officer has promoted in Local Authority News publication. Working with GIS Officer to develop more user friendly links before advertising on local print and social media in 2018. Calendar advertised on 2 local papers and also through social media advert during March.

Trade Shows: Attended the 50 plus Trade Show in Hodson Bay.

- Outdoor Recreation: Donamon and Castlerea Demesne project under Measure II 2017, match funding agreed.
 - 2018, Application for 2 projects submitted under Measure II. Sliabh Bawn application lodged for €187,000 and Suck Valley Way for €100,000.
- **Healthy Ireland:** Application submitted for 2018 scheme to develop county booklet on walks and outdoor activities. Awaiting decision.
- 2018 Festival and Events: 4 projects paid out to date.
