PLANNING DEPARTMENT

Forward Planning

Work associated with the impending drafting of the *Roscommon County Development Plan* 2021-2027 continued in October. A tender brief was prepared and advertised on e-Tenders seeking to engage consultants to prepare a *Housing Needs Demand Assessment (HNDA)*, which is a statutory requirement in preparing the Plan.

Meetings took place with Members in each of the three Municipal Districts (Boyle, Athlone and Roscommon on 20th, 21st and 27th October respectively), in advance of Members formal consideration, on 12th November, of the previously circulated *Chief Executive's Report* on submissions received during the pre-draft public consultation period. A range of issues and themes which arose through the public consultation process were highlighted at the meetings.

Development Management and Planning Enforcement Activity

The table below summarises Development Management activity in October. A total of 41 valid applications were received. Decisions issued on 31 planning applications, of which 27 were grants of permission (6 were for retention permission).

Unfinished Housing Developments (UHD)

Development activity continued on a number of unfinished housing developments in October. Developers were on site in six developments – three in Roscommon town and one each in Monksland, Frenchpark and Tarmonbarry. Contractors engaged by Roscommon County Council were also on sites, undertaking various site remediation works in five developments in Roscommon (1), Boyle (2) and Ballyleague (2). As part of the preliminary stage of the Taking in Charge process, schedules for two developments, Lakeview Heights in Boyle and Lisacul Park, Lisacul, were referred to Irish Water.

ECONOMIC AND DEVELOPMENT PROMOTION

Local Enterprise Office:

Trading On Line Vouchers (TOVs):

A total of 199 applications for TOVs were approved year to date. (A total of 190 TOVs have been approved with 90% funding since the funding was changed from 50% to 90%). A business which obtained a Voucher previously is eligible to apply for a second Voucher, if considered appropriate. The max grant remains at €2,500. A number of remote Information Seminars were held to facilitate clients wishing to apply as this is compulsory prior to making an application, with the next one is scheduled for the 11th November. Demand for this scheme locally and nationally is unprecedented. The 90% grant assistance is back in operation and still available to TOV applicants. No end date for the 90% funding has been set as yet by the DCCAE.

- Business Continuity Vouchers: The total number of applications received is 233, with 186 being eligible for funding. Each voucher is worth up to €2,500 in third party consultancy costs and can be used by companies and sole traders to develop short-term and long-term strategies to respond to the Covid-19 pandemic. All vouchers have now been processed.
- **Training:** The Autumn training programme is nearing completion with the exception of Brexit Customs workshops. A Quotation Document was prepared and Quotations sought for 2021 training. The closing date was 27th October.
- Remote Mentoring: Is being provided on an ongoing basis for the business community. General Business & Brexit Mentor Clinics are on offer and in demand. Bookings are taken via the LEO website online booking system.
- Enquiries: Enquiries are ongoing and appropriate support is being provided.
- Student Enterprise Programme: This programme has commenced in remote format with 8 of the 9 second level schools in the county engaging. Abbey Community College, Boyle, is taking part in Enterprise Encounter and the LEO has provided the requested support (this is where small groups of students pay a visit to businesses in the Boyle area, abiding by Covid-19 regulations).
- National Women's Enterprise Day: This Event took place remotely as a Nationally Event on the 14th October. It is an initiative driven by Local Enterprise Office Roscommon, along with 30 other Local Enterprise Offices around the country. National Women's Enterprise Day showcased stories, experiences and insights from Ireland's women-led companies and drew attention to the enterprise supports that are available locally. An Tánaiste and Minister for Enterprise, Trade and Employment, Leo Varadkar T.D., delivered the opening address. The Event was supported by Enterprise Ireland, the Local Authorities & the Government of Ireland.
- National Enterprise Awards: The current plan is for an Awards Ceremony to take place on February 11th 2021, but this will be monitored in line with Government guidelines for such Events and is subject to change. Assessment of Applications will take place in mid-November.

- **Promotion:** All LEO supports were promoted on the LEO website and on various social media platforms.
- Sites at Ballyboughan: 3 Enquiries ongoing.
- **Just Transition:** 3 applications submitted. Feasibility Study for the Boardwalk project successful.

Heritage:

National Biodiversity Action Plan Funding (NBAP):

A recoupment claim was submitted to the Department of Housing Local Government & Heritage for projects carried out under this scheme in 2020.

County Roscommon Swift Survey: 40 localities (towns and villages) in the county were surveyed. 117 active Swift nest sites were confirmed. The main Swift populations were found to exist in Roscommon Town with 44 active nests confirmed followed by Boyle and Ballaghaderreen with 14 and 12 respectively.

The key to ensuring a future for Swifts in the county is to protect existing colonies which act as a source population. To ensure this happens it is important to encourage individual communities to take ownership and responsibility for their local Swifts and to carry out the required actions to protect them into the future.

Tourism

Introduction of Level 5 has resulted in the closure for 6 weeks of all Activities and Attractions. Limited services being provided in some Hotels and take out services in restaurants.

Covid 19 Initiatives:

Roscommon Community Response Forum:

As part of the Governments response to the COVID-19 crisis, Roscommon County Council in partnership with principal response agencies and community and voluntary groups have come together to form the Community Response Forum to lead the co-ordination of the COVID-19 community supports and resilience. The Forum beings together a number of organisations to identify vulnerable groups and individual in Roscommon and to ensure delivery of targeted social care supports and assistance to vulnerable groups and individuals.

The Forum met twice in October and will continue to meet regularly to discuss and resolve matters utilising the expertise contained within this multi partnership team.

Community Support Response Helpline:

Roscommon County Council in partnership with An Garda Siochana and Roscommon Leader Company have set up a 24 hour Freephone community support response help line to assist in the delivery of targeted social care supports and assistance to vulnerable groups and individuals. During the month of October, 20 calls were received.

Shoot dates are from 16th November to 18th December 2020.

Roscommon Arts Centre

The arts centre had to once again close to the public under Level 3 Restrictions & the work of cancelling and/or re-scheduling performance and refunding customers once again began.

Visual Art Programme

In advance of this, artist Paul Hallahan's exhibition "Running, Returning, Running" was installed and opened in the gallery space. Visual Art Writer in Residence Joanne Laws also produced an essay responding to the show.

As lockdown was announced a virtual tour of this exhibition and an online version of the essay were produced and are available to watch via the arts centre's website.

Creative Ireland Residencies: Two artists: Mintesinot Getachew (Dance) and Leonora Neary (Music) commenced three month residencies on site at the centre – these residencies now continue off-site with supports being provided to both artists at this time by staff.

Fregoli Theatre Company Residency: The final phase of Fregoli Theatre Company's residency got underway in October when they commenced a re-imagined Professional Development Strand. The company also launch "Home for Christmas" a virtual presentation responding to what Christmas means to people, which will be developed following an open call to the public to share their Christmas memories with the company. Coupled with this, Fregoli have begun the rehearsal period for their new play in development "Cross Street" which will be recorded in November for a virtual presentation.

Artist Supports: A planned residency by artist Cathal Cleary & Mommo Theatre Company has been deferred with Arts Council approval until 2021, along with Julie Dharkey's planned presentation of "An Ant Called Amy". A third artist the centre is supporting in 2020, Ronan Brady is continuing work on a short virtual dance/circus performance: "Not So Ros-common" which will be released later this year.

Mid-term Programme: To coincide with the mid-term break, Roscommon Arts Centre once again shared daily art and craft activities for families to undertake via Facebook.

Arts Council 2021 Application: In October the arts centre submitted a substantial funding application to the Arts Council for 2021. An application for €330,000 was made to the Arts Council to support this ambitious new programme of work in response to the Council's callout for venues to reimagine their spaces next year and make provision to support artists & engage with the public in new ways in 2021. The application includes a substantial visual art programme, with supporting education and engagement elements, a reduced performance programme, increased supports for artists, year two of a residency by Fregoli Theatre Company and a new full-length in-house production by the company and a number of community focused initiatives around the county. Provision has also been made in this application to commission a number of visual artists for the 2022 programme.
