2. Project Summary

Preserving Roscommon's Field Names through Community & Creativity

This project aims to collect, preserve, and creatively interpret traditional field names in County Roscommon. Working with local communities, artists, and schools, we will record the linguistic, cultural, and ecological stories embedded in our local landscapes and present them through visual art, storytelling, and a publicly accessible archive.

3. Objectives

- To document and preserve the traditional field names of County Roscommon.
- To engage communities (especially older generations and schoolchildren) in the heritage of place.
- To creatively interpret collected field names through art, stories, and performance.
- To produce a lasting digital and printed resource for future generations.

4. Methodology & Creative Elements

Phase 1: Community Engagement & Collection (July - August 2025)

- Host 2 local workshops (one rural, one town-based) introducing the project.
- Train local volunteers and students in collecting field names (oral interviews, mapreading, folklore).

Phase 2: Creative Workshops & Interpretation (September - October 2025)

- Facilitate:
 - A visual art workshop (youth-led or intergenerational).
 - o A creative writing/storytelling session.
 - o A bilingual storytelling or recording event for Irish-language names.
- Commission 1 local artist to illustrate a "Map of Memory" a creative map of selected field names and stories.

Phase 3: Archive, Display & Sharing (November 2025)

- Develop a digital PDF booklet (and printed copies) with field names, stories, and illustrations.
- Host a community event to present the project's outcomes.

• Upload material to Roscommon County Council's website and/or Creative Ireland platform.

5. Outcomes

- 30–50 field names collected and documented.
- Creative outputs: Illustrated map, stories/poems, audio recordings.
- **Digital and physical legacy**: A small-scale publication and digital archive.
- **Community impact**: Intergenerational participation, renewed interest in local heritage.
