

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
What's in the Grass?

3) Color the blades of grass green.






Robins are very charitable birds, sometimes feeding the chicks of other species.



MAKE YOUR OWN BIRD FEEDER

Help out our feathered friends by making them a colourful homemade bird feeder that they can perch on while having a tasty, nutritious snack.





STEP

Gather your materials

- Fresh seeds or bird mix
- Peanuts
- · Dried fruit such as raisins or sultanas · Pencil or chopstick
- · Mixing bowl
- Scissors

- · A piece of string
- 1L milk or juice carton
- · Paint, paper, glue to decorate your bird feeder

STEP 2

*Cut windows out of two opposite sides of the milk carton, leaving about 5 cm at the bottom of the carton for the birdseed.





STEP \$

*Punch a hole through both of the other sides of the carton near the top. Thread the string through one of the holes.

STEP 4

Thread the string through the other hole on the opposite side and then tie a knot to secure it.

STEP S

*Make a hole just below both of the windows. Push a pencil or chopstick through the holes to make a perch for the birds to sit on as they eat.

STEP 6.

(Optional)

*Cut out triangle-shaped wings from each side (if you want to design it to look like a bird).



STEP 7

Colour will attract birds so now it's time to decorate!

Paint your bird feeder. Then cut shapes out of paper to make eyes, feet or any other decorations you like. Glue them on

Fill your colourful feeder with birdseed, nuts or dried fruit.

STEP 8

Hang your bird feeder outside on a tree branch and wait for your feathery friends to come by and say hello!

MAKE YOUR OWN BIRD FEED BALLS

Help out garden birds nearby by making homemade bird feed balls that are full of nutrition to keep them healthy and active throughout the year.



STEP 1

Gather your materials

- · Fat such as lard or coconut oil
- Fresh seeds bird mix if you have it String (30cm)
- · Crushed peanuts or peanut butter
- · Raisins or apples
- · Mixing bowl

- Scissors
- · Yoghurt cartons (optional)
- Fridge

STEP 2

Measure out one part fat to two parts food mix (fresh seeds, crushed peanuts or peanut butter, raisins or apples). You will need twice the amount of food mix as fat see photo.





STEP 3

Rub the fat between your fingers so that it becomes soft. The fat will help to stick the ingredients together. Place your food mix and fat together in a bowl and mix everything together using your hands.



Gather 30 cm string and tie a large knot in the ends so that the string is now in a secure loop that will not open.





Bluetits are very acrobatic and can hang upside down on branches.

STEP 5

(Optional)

Place the knot end of the string in a clean, empty yoghurt container.

Take the bird feed mix you prepared in step 3 and mould it around the knot within the yogurt pot.

STEP 6

(Optional)

Make sure the mix is fully moulded and compact around the knot within the yoghurt pot by patting with your hands.



STEP 7

If you don't have a yoghurt pot, place the knot end of the string in your hand. Take the bird feed mix you prepared in step 3 (fat/feed mix) and mould it around the knot. Make sure the mix is fully moulded/compact around the knot by patting it with hands.

STEP 8

Place your bird feed mix in the fridge overnight to allow it to set.

Next morning, find a nice tree branch outside to hang your bird feed on (remove yoghurt pot beforehand if you used a pot).

Now simply wait for your feathery garden bird friends to come by and have their tasty treat!


Activity Sheet

With an adult, take a look around you and make note of all of the different types of nature that you see. Be careful near water and try not to disturb any wildlife that you see.


