

### Site Location & Development of Proposal

The subject site, which is served by Local Road L-60325, is located at Clooncagh National School c. 6km south of Strokestown town centre. The subject site comprises an astro-turf playing pitch at the rear of a national school, and the site boundaries of same. The astro-turf pitch is bounded on three sides by agricultural land. There are no European designated sites in, adjoining or in close proximity to the subject site. There is no known heritage related sites/structures in very close proximity to the subject site, as per the Roscommon County Council GIS.

### Section 2. -(1)

Section 3. -(1)

In this Act, "development" means, except where the context otherwise requires, the carrying out of any works on, in, over or under land or the making of any material change in the use of any structures or other land.

Section 4(1) of the Act defines certain types of development as being 'exempted development'. Of potential relevance is section 4(1)(a) which provides as follows:

Development consisting of the use of any land for the purposes of agriculture and development consisting of the use for that purpose of any building occupied together with land so used;

Section 4 (2) of the Planning and Development Act provides that the Minister, by regulations, provide for any class of development to be exempted development. The principal regulations made under this provision are the Planning and Development Regulations.

Subject to article 9, development of a class specified in column 1 of Part 3 of Schedule 2 shall be exempted development for the purposes of the Act, provided that such development complies with the conditions and limitations specified in column 2 of the said Part 3 opposite the mention of that class in the said column 1.

### Planning Assessment:

The proposal involves the erection of netting around an existing astro turf pitch at Clooncagh National School, Strokestown. The purpose of the netting, which is to be placed along 2 no. boundaries only, is to prevent balls etc leaving the playing area. The stated materials to be used are 3 no. 10m wooden poles, stay wire, sanchors, blocks, 50mm netting, cables and fittings. It is unclear from the documentation

submitted how the as constructed works will appear once completed. I am satisfied that the proposal can be considered works that are ancillary to those set out in Class 33, as outlined above, however clarification is needed on what (if any) visual impact the proposal will have before a determination can be made so that the provisions of Article 9(1)(a)(vi) can be excluded.






